



NCA's Worlds Bid Declaration – Team NCA

The 2008-2009 season marks the sixth consecutive year that Team NCA has been sending athletes to represent us at the USASF Worlds Championship. A majority of the teams crowned "World Champion" since the first ceremony in 2004 are successful NCA programs, many of which actually earned their bid at the NCA National Championship.

This year, NCA will be awarding more PAID bids of any other All-Star Championship in the United States. In addition to the 5 PAID Bids, Team NCA will also include 10 AT-LARGE BIDS and 10 INTERNATIONAL BIDS.

The process for awarding the bids will be as follows:

PAID BIDS

NCA will be awarding PAID BIDS to the National Champions in the following 5 divisions:

- Level 5 Small Senior
- Level 5 Large Senior
- Level 5 Large Senior Limited Coed
- Level 5 Small Senior Limited Coed
- Level 5 Senior Unlimited Coed

In the event that any of these 5 teams have a previously earned PAID bid from another event producer, NCA will move the extra bid(s) to the next overall highest score(s) within these divisions and the Level 5 Semi-Limited Coed division.

AT-LARGE BIDS

Once the PAID bids have been secured, NCA will award 10 AT-LARGE bids to the next 10 overall highest scores within these divisions (to include Level 5 Semi-Limited Coed). In the event that any of these 10 teams have a previously earned AT-LARGE bid from another event producer, NCA will move the extra bid(s) to the next overall highest score(s) within these divisions.

INTERNATIONAL (AT-LARGE) BIDS

NCA will be awarding 10 INTERNATIONAL bids in the following divisions:

- Level 5 International Open
- Level 5 International Open Coed
- Level 6 Open*
- Level 6 Open Coed*

Within the 4 qualifying International/Open divisions, the 10 overall highest scores will be awarded the INTERNATIONAL bids. In the event that any of these 10 teams have a previously earned INTERNATIONAL bid from another event producer, NCA will move the extra bid(s) to the next overall highest score(s) within these divisions.

Once these divisions have been extended their bids, any extra INTERNATIONAL bids will then be moved to the Junior category and awarded to the overall highest scores in the following divisions:

Level 5 Small Junior
Level 5 Large Junior
Level 5 Junior Coed

Junior teams that receive these bids will have the opportunity to compete in the Junior International Divisions at Worlds.

As a universal rule of thumb:

In the event of a tie for any bid position, the bid will be awarded to the team with the highest DAY 2 score.

*Teams that earn INTERNATIONAL bids in the Level 6 Open and Level 6 Open Coed division will be required to follow USASF size restrictions (5-24 members) when competing at the Worlds.
